MEDICAL & WORK TEAMS

In March, two medical teams and one work team came to San Lorenzo to work with Dr. Jane and the Clinic staff. It was a busy month; but, with God's help, a lot was accomplished!

At the beginning of the month, an eight-member eye team from Vision Outreach International visited the Clinic to perform eye surgeries. One of the patients they saw was a young man named, Victor, who has two diseases, both of which cause blindness. One, keratoconus, is curable with cornea transplants. The other, retinitis pigmentosa, has no cure. Dr. Stan Pletcher (shown below with Victor) took Victor to Shell, Ecuador where the transplants were done. However, one of the transplants has failed because Victor could not afford the necessary eye drops. Eventually, Victor will be blind as a result of the retinitis pigmentosa. Yet, as you can see in the picture, he has not let this disease get him down. He remains the friendly and happy young man he has always been -- in spite of the fact he is going blind.



Immediately following the eye team, plastic surgeon Dr. Geoff Randolph and nurse Janine Bernabé (both from Fort Wayne, Indiana), visited the Clinic. During their stay, a total of 14 surgeries were performed and many lives were changed in dramatic ways!

One of the patients who had surgery is five-month-old Renata. She has both a cleft lip and a cleft palate. Dr. Randolph operated on Renata to repair her cleft lip. (Surgery for her cleft palate will need to occur later.) As you can see from the before and after pictures, shown below, Renata will grow up with a beautiful, new smile!



We would also like to extend a very special "thank you" to Dr. Obinna Onuora, an anesthesiologist from Fargo, North Dakota. Dr. Onuora spent two weeks at the Clinic, providing anesthesia for both the eye team



and the plastic surgeries. Securing qualified anesthesiologists for surgery weeks is one of the greatest challenges Dr. Jane faces each month. We are very grateful to Dr. Onuora for his contribution to two weeks of successful surgeries!

On March 16, Mark Wurzel and four other men traveled to San Lorenzo to help with a variety of construction projects. Mark has coordinated groups from southern Michigan for the past several years, and they are always a tremendous blessing! They are working at the Clinic as this article is being written.
