BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

When Dr. Jane began offering surgical services at the San Lorenzo Clinic over 10 years ago, she performed simple procedures such as uncomplicated hernias which could be performed under local or regional anesthesia. Today, the facilities at the Clinic have improved to the extent that she regularly performs hysterectomies, thyroidectomies and other complicated procedures which require general anesthesia.

Although the surgical services at the Clinic have expanded greatly in the past 10 years, the post-operative patient quarters have changed very little.

The albergue (al-BEAR-gay), where patients recuperate after surgery, is very cramped. It contains two small rooms -- one for men and one for women. Each room can accommodate five patients. Although adequate, the albergue is not ideal. It is in a separate building from the operating suite, has no nurses station and no space for monitoring equipment.

The Ecuadorian Ministry of Health is not satisfied with these facilities and has asked the Clinic to improve them. Also, in order to be officially classified as a "clinic" again, there must be an emergency room included in the facilities.

(You may remember that we reported in the April LAMBlines that the Ministry of Health will not permit the Clinic to function as a "clinic" until it has four separate specialties, improved post-operative facilities and an emergency room. For now, the Clinic is functioning as a "surgery center" which severely limits Dr. Jane's practice. Read the April edition of LAMBlines for more details.)

Dr. Jane and Dámarys have worked closely with LAMB supporter Paul Graber and an Ecuadorian engineer to finalize plans for a new, 20-bed hospitalization building. Pictured below, this new building will attach to the two main buildings of the Clinic and provide an improved patient care area.

Dr. Jane, Dámarys and the Clinic staff have been dreaming to have a facility like this since at least 2008. We want to be able to begin construction of the hospitalization building in August, during the dry season, when it is easier to build. In order to do that, we need your help!
